Dr. Whit Jones, the author of Apologia's <i>American Literature</i>, has provided us with a comprehensive literature curriculum in a single textbook, with the exception of five short pieces of literature (Huckleberry Finn, The Great Gatsby, The Old Man and the Sea, To Kill A Mockingbird, and A Raisin in the Sun) which will be acquired separately. All background information on the authors, pertinent historical discussions, and excerpts of literature, along with all of our discussion questions, are included in this sizable, visually attractive text, which will need to be acquired before the first day of class. If you need help finding an affordable copy, let me know. While this course offers an extensive writing element, we will focus only on reading the assignments and submitting written answers to the discussion questions. If you are interested in having your student complete the writing and/or testing options to be submitted for grades, please contact me. Also, some of these novels contain mature themes and worldly, promiscuous thinking, but they portray the American culture at the time and will be analyzed according to a biblical worldview. Please take time to read reviews on these pieces prior to registration to see if you are comfortable with your student reading the material.</p> <p>If students wish to join us 2nd semester, we'd love to have them! In this Introductory class, students will become acquainted with Latin vocabulary, grammar, syntax; learn how to translate; and memorize a variety of passages in Latin. All Latin grammar lessons will be compared to English grammar. (Students should have a basic understanding of English grammar.) Nouns and adjectives of the first and second declensions, and verbs of the first conjugation, will be introduced. This class will use the Latin Road to English Grammar (LRTEG) curriculum, which employs a multisensory style of teaching: Students will hear, say, see, read, and write the language frequently. LRTEG uses the “Church” (Italian) pronunciation. Exercises, Worksheets and Tests will be assigned as homework. (I will grade tests, and answer keys will be provided for at-home grading. I offer an “office hour” each week to answer questions, by text or phone call, that may arise while working at home.) To learn the material well, there is a fair amount of work each week. Moms, please consider learning Latin alongside your student!
